

Early On[®] List of Assessment Tools

The list of assessment tools approved by the Michigan Department of Education (MDE) for Child Outcomes Summary (COS) rating includes:

1. Assessment, Evaluation and Programming Tool (AEPS)
2. Battelle Developmental Inventory, Second Edition (BDI-2)
3. Bayley Scales of Infant Toddler Development
4. Brigance[®] Inventory of Early Development-II (IED-II)
5. Carolina Curriculum for Infants and Toddlers with Special Needs (CCITSN), Third Edition
6. Early Intervention Developmental Profile (EIDP)
7. Early Learning Accomplishment Profile (E-LAP)
8. Hawaii Early Learning Profile (HELP)
9. Infant-Toddler Developmental Assessment (IDA) & Infant-Toddler Developmental Assessment 2nd Edition (IDA-2)
10. Other

Other: Providers may use an assessment tool other than one of the first nine listed. Some other tools worth considering are:

1. Measurement of Engagement, Interaction and Social Relationships (MEISR) - The functional items of this instrument are cross walked with the three child outcomes and organized by age. This makes it a valuable tool for age anchoring a child's functional abilities within each of the three outcomes.
2. Routines Based Interview (RBI) – This is an evidence-based assessment practice that gathers information about home and community routines and the child's engagement, independence, and social relationships within those routines to promote routines-based intervention.
